They gather at their country estate for an Easter that will mark a new beginning for each of them.

Stephen Sewell is one of our leading playwrights, whose plays (TRAITORS, WELCOME THE BRIGHT WORLD, THE BLIND GIANT IS DANCING and DREAMS IN AN EMPTY CITY) have been produced both nationally and internationally.

HATE is directed by Neil Armfield and designed by Stephen Curtis, with a new musical score by Alan John — the production team which delivered the premieres of DREAMS IN AN EMPTY CITY (Adelaide Festival 1986) and THE BLIND GIANT IS DANCING (Lighthouse 1983).

The head of the family is Desmond Kelly, one of New Zealand's leading actors, seen recently in the AFI award-winner THE NAVIGATOR. His wife Eloise is played by Pat Bishop, their sons are Denis Moore and David Slingsby and Gillian Jones is the daughter.
